THEY ALL TOLD ME THAT I MATTERED.

I have Eastside Academy to thank for the trajectory of my life. I first learned about EA from a peer after I showed up intoxicated to work. I was only fourteen. Yet, unbeknownst to me, my peer had been dealing with her own demons; and without judgment, she listened. She shared with me her testimony and how much Eastside Academy had changed her life.

I was wrestling with my own undiagnosed mental health challenges, traumas, and addictions. Everything triggered my use both big and small. It felt like everything and everyone was against me. But at Eastside Academy, for the first time in my entire life, I felt like my entire existence was validated. Teachers, my counselors, the staff, they all told me that I mattered. And that mattered. Eastside Academy taught me how to care about myself.

Eastside Academy takes a different approach to a troubled child, not through discipline but through listening and through support. It's hard to compare EA to another school or even completely describe the all encompassing care you experience as a student who's not used to receiving that kind of love. Teachers go above and beyond teaching. They walk with you through life's hurdles and they stay with you beyond graduation.

During the pandemic, I found myself at rock bottom. It was a dark and terrifying place. But EA was there to support me with arms wide open; receiving me, listening to me, and helping pay for the six months of treatment I desperately needed.

Today I am in a completely different place. I am working at Harborview Medical Center as the Program Coordinator for the Opioid Treatment Program and I am on the Board of the Peace Coalition in South King County, recently nominated to be the co-chair of the board. I love being able to give back to the community and to make a difference in the lives of others who are experiencing the same sorts of challenges I did. It's because of Eastside Academy that I am able to have the life that I do, that I'm able to see a different future for myself, and that I'm able to make a difference. Thank you for believing in Eastside Academy, because by doing so, you've also believed in me.



At Eastside Academy, we believe change happens when you allow yourself to trust and be known. We are an alternative Christian high school that offers a holistic and integrated support system for students who need more support than the traditional high school experience offers. Our purpose is to walk alongside students, families, and alumni in their journey toward hope and a future, with a strong emphasis on "alongside." From education to counseling to recovery to housing to mentoring and everything in between, we foster true, honest relationships with our students in a faith-based environment that helps them heal and thrive. Since 2001, Eastside Academy has made a difference in the lives of many, ensuring every student has the opportunity to receive the education and services they deserve.

Throughout the 2022-2023 school year, we experienced a student body with greater needs than years prior, requiring a greater level and intensity of care. The long lasting effects of COVID on the mental health of students is continuing to create more intense challenges for their well-being. This year our students averaged 1.5 sessions of mental health care per week to help them work through challenges and past traumatic experiences. As they put in the work, and receive the support from our highly trained and caring staff, we've seen them achieve a tremendous amount of success.

OUR PURPOSE IS TO WALK ALONGSIDE STUDENTS, FAMILIES, AND ALUMNI IN THEIR JOURNEY TOWARD HOPE AND A FUTURE.

The 2022-2023 school year marked an important year of growth for Eastside Academy in the lives of students, their families, and for us as a non-profit organization. This year due to an intentional investment in our communications strategy, combined with an increased presence in the community, we were able to serve 47 students, representing a 46% increase in student enrollment over last year. We were also able to serve 67 families and alumni and offered support to a total of 114 people in our community. As we worked hard this year to rebuild in the wake of the pandemic, we are excited to build on these successful new strategies in the upcoming year.

Our partnerships with community businesses, organizations, and individuals has continued to be an important element of transforming the lives of our students. Through career days, job shadow experiences, snow-boarding lessons, and academic experiences beyond the classroom, we have been able to spark curiosity and instill a newfound belief within our students that they can trust in their future.

With a sense of joy and pride we graduated four seniors in June, each of whom received scholarships through the Gregory McBride Scholarship Fund, the Windermere Foundation, or as an Act 6 Scholar, enabling them to invest in their future. Our halls and classrooms were filled with cheers upon learning that one of our graduates received a four-year, full-ride scholarship at Pacific Lutheran University through the highly competitive Act 6 Program. It was a beautiful moment of possibility and example for all of our students.

Our graduation ceremony also brought about a beautiful full-circle moment. For the first time, we had an alumnus serve as the keynote speaker. Jonathan Janssen, Class of 2016, shared about his growth and the impactful lessons he took with him from his four years at Eastside Academy. Jonathan said:

"I learned about respect, responsibility, and the importance of taking ownership of my actions. I learned to listen, that no one fights alone. More importantly, Eastside Academy showed me the true meaning of support and what it means to help others in their fight."

It is these powerful, full-circle moments that remind us that the work at Eastside Academy is lasting and filled with transformative change.

We are a non-profit that partners with our community to make change happen. We believe that these partnerships bring a large measure of mindfulness and care to our work because we represent your desire to serve, care, and impact young lives. 

Eastside Academy student Nate was forced to move around to various homeless shelters after being abandoned by his mentally ill mother. He worked multiple jobs to support himself while trying to attend school. EA's Chaplain, Drew Hale, worked with Nate to connect him with the YMCA transitional housing program. Through this program, he qualified for a studio apartment with rent assistance. The transition from homelessness to a safe and stable place to live has allowed him to gain stability that he never before experienced. Nate and Drew created a solid plan for his life post-high school. Since then, Nate as started a GED program which allowed him more flexibility to continue working, and is enjoying his new found independence and stability.



MENTORSHIP HIGHLIGHTS

Anna is my third mentee at Eastside Academy. I have been mentoring for four year and still keep in touch with a previous mentee. This year has been a great year with Anna and we hit it off immediately. We always have something to talk about and I love hearing about how she is doing in her classes and with her friends. She is so sweet and has grown so much!

Growing up, I spent a lot of time on my own and made some terrible decisions. I didn't have anyone to help me make better choices until later in life. I love having the chance to be there for someone who may not have anyone else to turn to, talk to, or just hang out with. I love that I get to do that for 3 years with Anna.

COUNSELING & ADDICTION RECOVERY

At Eastside Academy, a student can have up to 70 counseling sessions in a single school year.

After multiple years at EA, two guarded students took huge risks during their individual counseling sessions and fully opened themselves to the counseling process. For these individuals, openness came with a cost - both students knew EA would be required to call CPS if they shared their story and knew lives beyond their own would be impacted. However, being at Eastside Academy allowed each of these students to experience healthy relationships with trustworthy adults, and in time trust was built and they allowed their walls to come down. It took these students great courage and faith in Eastside Academy's program to be transparent. They experienced pain and freedom from talking about, identifying, and processing life events with their counselor. Both said their vulnerability led to reward and that learning to trust is something they value and hope to do more of. One student said EA played a big part in being more authentic and free.
